#### WILD GIFT ANNUAL REPORT 2022

#### Friends,

It brings me great joy to bring you the Wild Gift report of 2022. We built on our two decades of experience to expand our impact and deliver additional programs in wilderness' both new and known. In 2022, for the first time, we delivered two cohorts of Wild Gift fellows. The spring cohort trekked through the wilds of southern Utah's Canyonlands - experiencing seventeen days in the far reaches of the desert whilst honing their venture and leadership skills. The summer cohort took in the Boulder and White Cloud ranges in central Idaho, keeping the smoke at bay they soloed on ridge-tops, overcame sprained ankles, and built lifelong connections to each other and the wild.

I'm also happy to report that in 2022 we took the first step in expanding our programming by introducing Wild Strides, a shortened pilot version of our wilderness experience. Led by our incredible program director, Cassidy, Wild Strides partnered with SheFly to bring together eight women who have founded and lead outdoor companies into the Enchantments in Washington state for a 4 day experience. This pilot was so successful that we're rolling out more Wild Strides in 2023 so keep a lookout for one near you!

Finally, our alumni continue to have an outsized impact in the world. In this report we're highlighting the 2022 fellows, with ventures ranging from software to foodtech to concrete to everything in between, all focused on making the world a better place.

Our alums have raised over \$500M, reduced carbon emissions by the '000s of tons, and become changemakers around the world. Please join me in congratulating them on all their accomplishments. I look forward to sharing their and our journeys with you in 2023.




## Our Values

## **2022 Wins**

In 2022 we set an ambitious goal of doubling our treks - a goal we accomplished in taking fellows to both Utah and Idaho! We also wanted to increase our impact by piloting a new, shortened version of the Wild Gift experience.


We achieved this by piloting Wild Strides in the Washington wilderness in summer 2022. The pilot was so successful that we are rolling out more Wild Strides in 2023! We also grew in staff numbers and partnerships, all with the goal of allowing more leaders to be impacted by a Wild experience as they grow individually and as venture founders.



#### In summary...

- · We trekked in Idaho, Utah, and Washington
- **Doubled** the number of fellows from 5 in 2021 to 10 in 2022
- **Doubled** the number of treks from 1 to 2
- Tripled the number of total applicants
- Successfully piloted Wild Strides
- Held 4 alumni events around the country
- Held annual community event in Idaho
- Doubled the number of staff

## **Financials**





Wild Gift supported two classes of five fellows in 2022 as well as a pilot of Wild Strides. Expenses were slightly lower than expected because we did not run a river trip made efficiency gains administrative work. Income was less than expected because of a fundraising crunch owing to uncertainty in the economy alongside rising interest rates. Major included the expenses positive increase staffing, additional facilitation, program and reintroduced grants to fellows. Major income sources included private donations and endowment distributions.

In 2023 we expect a positive increase in donations as well as additional revenue from Wild Strides. Expenses are expected to be less than 2022 as we return to one class of fellows in 2023 in an effort to maintain a balanced budget.

### **A National Impact**

Our class of 2022 came from from the Bay Area and Oregon to Colorado, Texas and Illinois then all the way to New York to work on their ventures with like minded individuals. More information on each of their ventures can be found on our website at wildgift.org/alumni.
